There was the series Alpha, Beta, Gamma, Delta first
Which were built between 1/1985 and 7/1987.

From 8/1987 gabs then alpha, beta, gamma and delta. 2

Features of radios:

Alpha 1 = mono radio without cassette without preset buttons, station search just with seek tuning, search sensitivity convertible, only FM, sound balance.

Beta = 1 as Alpha, an additional 4 preset buttons, tuning possible manually and via search, medium wave

Gamma = 1 stereo radio with cassette, or as Beta

Delta Gamma 1 = As, in addition Autoreverse, Cr / Me switching, Dolby, separate bass / treble controls rather than sound balance

The Generation 2 has a slightly different design with helical fluted buttons, it focuses on the design of the switches in 35i anticipated.

Differences in equipment for generation 1:

Alpha = additional 4 preset buttons

Beta = additional stereo and cassette deck, but no central shaft

Gamma = additional auto-reverse and Gala, Anti-theft by code number

Delta = additional 8 instead of 4 presets for FM, Gala, Travel Ari by incorporating a second receiver, automatic instead of manual tape type switching, protection against theft by numeric code

All radios could get to the option of using an automatic antenna.

in the Prospectus 1987 price list "as of 12.29.1986" the radios are listed all.

Gamma gabs for all models for 824, - DM

for CL, GL, GT and GT syncro models for 795, - DM

Delta gabs for all models for 1224 - DM

CL, GL, GT and GT syncro models for 1195, - DM

Each with manual rod antenna.

The "Automatic antenna" cost 167, - DM cost.

Gross difference: delta had in addition to gamma

- Auto Reverse
- Dolby Noise Reduction
- CR-Tape Selector button whatever that is.
